Daily Planning

Example Daily Plan:

- Morning:
 - Feed animals & collect eggs if you have chickens.
 - Water garden.
 - Check fence lines.
- Afternoon:
 - Work on building project (e.g., chicken coop).
 - Weed garden.
- Evening:
 - Harvest from the garden
 - Check for pest in the garden use organic friendly products to eliminate pest
 - Check on livestock and feed pm feeding.

Weekly Planning

Outline your weekly goals and recurring tasks. This section helps you maintain a consistent rhythm and ensures all essential homestead activities are addressed each week.

Example Weekly Plan:

- Monday: Garden maintenance (weeding, pruning).
- Tuesday: Livestock care (hoof trimming, health checks).

- Autumn: livestock stalls and chicken coop maintenance, deworm (if needed).
- Winter: Ensure stalls and chicken coop winterized (cold climates) deworm (if needed)

Garden Tracking

Keep track of your garden's progress, including planting dates, yields, and any challenges encountered. This information is invaluable for future planning and improving your garden's productivity.

Record Keeping:

- Plant Variety
- Planting Date
- Harvest Date
- Yield
- Notes (Pest/Disease, Watering, Fertilizer)

Livestock Management

Maintain detailed records of your livestock's health, breeding cycles, and production. This ensures the well-being of your animals and helps optimize their contribution to the homestead.

Record Keeping:

- Animal ID
- Breed
- Birth Date
- Vaccination/Medical Records
- Breeding Records
